## **CREATIVE EXPLORATION**

Look at the image closely and answer the following questions:

What countries around the world would you like to visit?

195 countries!! How many do you think you can name? Start a list and ask everyone in your house and see if they can help.

Is there anyone in the image that looks like you? Or someone you know? If you could send a postcard to one of the children, who would you choose and why?

## **ART ACTIVITY**

MATERIALS: Paper, cardboard, colouring pencils or markers, pencil, string, world map or globe

Today, we are going to learn about life in different countries and we'll be making masks. If you don't have a map or globe use an online map: https://www.google.com/earth/



## Activity 1: Around the world

Chris Judge's illustration presents 195 children, one from each country in the world. To start we are going to learn a little bit more about some of these countries and the lives of the children who live there. You'll need to take a globe or world map. Close your eyes and point to a country!

You'll need help from an adult who can help you find out some of the interesting things about the country you picked. What animals do they have? What is the weather like? If you lived in this country what language would you speak, what food would you eat, what games would you play?

Which of the 195 children from Chris Judge's illustration do you think lives in the country you picked?

Take your sheet of paper and begin to draw out all that is unique about the country you picked. For example if you picked Australia, you might draw a kangaroo, a sunny beach or the Sydney Opera House! Use pencils and colouring pencils (or markers) to colour in your drawings. Cut out each of your drawings and set aside. Check out our tutorial video.

## Activity 2: Mask making

We're going to make a mask that captures some of the wonderful things about the country you picked. Take your cardboard box and draw out a large oval shape that will cover all of your face. Mark out the eyes, mouth and nose. You might need help cutting out the mask.

Use your colouring pencils or markers to colour in the face of your mask. Take your drawings and stick them around the face. Make two holes at each side of the face where the string can go through. Ask for help to tie up your string and your mask will be ready to wear!

Well done you've learnt a lotl about one country. Just 194 more to go!!!
